

I have been at HGH for 1.5 years. I attended Juniata College undergrad (BS in Biochemistry), Drexel Hahnemann University for medical school, and Yale University for MBA. I grew up in Goshen, CT.

I joined the US Army during medical school, looking for adventure and a way to pay for my education. The result of that decision was 16 years of amazing travel, teamwork, varied cultural experiences, and receiving remarkable opportunities for growth and leadership. I served two years with Special Forces in Germany as the Flight Surgeon. During that time, I helped trained Special Forces Medics, maintained the health of soldiers and their families, aided combat evacuation and search and rescue, provided medical care to hundreds of thousands of refugees, and fought in the Gulf War. I then had my orthopedic surgery residency at the premier military hospital, Walter Reed before I served at Tripler Hospital in Hawaii, training residents and deploying with the 8th Forward Surgical Team and the 25th Infantry Division. Since my military career I have had several leadership opportunities from Chairman of Orthopedics at Santa Clara Valley Medical Center to developing orthopedic trauma programs at several hospitals. The past four years has seen me working to mentor surgeons as Chair of Surgery and build surgical programs as well as improve efficiency and camaraderie.

I joined ACHE in 2019 at the encouragement of my mentor, Mr. Kurt A. Barwis, Regent of ACHE and CEO of Bristol Hospital. I was excited by the career development and networking available through ACHE. 

Recognizing Member Achievements

Taking time to acknowledge leaders at the local level.

During the past few months, ACHE chapters have acknowledged leaders for various efforts, as well as focused on the professional development they need in 2023. Following are examples of chapter initiatives and events that provided value for and recognition of members.

Resiliency, Recovery and Reigniting the Passion for Healthcare Leadership

Health Care Management Association of Central New York covers a wide swath of the state—a total of 41 counties are included in the chapter's reach.

The chapter serves a diverse group of healthcare leaders from various settings, including academic medical centers, integrated health systems, post-acute settings and small community hospitals, rural health providers, governmental and regulatory leaders. To address the diverse interests and backgrounds of the membership, the chapter provides a variety of educational offerings:

- Each year, an annual conference is offered with ACHE Face-to-Face Education and ACHE Qualified Education credits to support advancement to Fellow status. Also, the chapter recently concluded a two-year offering of a Board of Governors Exam Prep Series aimed at providing best-practice education and experience from industry leaders to prospective members advancing to Fellow.
- Local program councils are offered in various markets throughout the state, including Rochester, Albany and Syracuse, to bring educational and networking opportunities to local markets to mitigate geographic challenges posed with such a large chapter reach.
- In 2023, the chapter will be evolving with a renewed focus on in-person educational and networking opportunities.

The chapter's focus is not only on the resiliency of healthcare leaders facing accelerating rates of burnout and departure from the industry but also on reigniting the spirit of caring for patients and employees. Resiliency is only the first step toward sustainability. It will focus on recovery from the pandemic's operational, financial and psychological impact, as well as reengage and reignite the passion of its leaders so they gain a deeper understanding of why they chose to work in healthcare.

The chapter also plans to collaborate with local educational institutions and other affiliated organizations, provide networking events throughout the state to reconnect with colleagues and contacts within the field, and reestablish itself as a leading resource in New York for healthcare leaders and students.

In 2023, Health Care Management Association of Central New York will be evolving with a renewed focus on in-person educational and networking opportunities.

ACHE of South Florida 2022 Fellow Celebration and Networking Event

This Fellow-only event celebrates a key constituent of ACHE, recognizing the attainment of the gold standard in healthcare management certification. The occasion is also an opportunity to applaud Fellows' commitment to lifelong learning and contributions to the field, ACHE and the chapter.

"It was an honor to recognize and celebrate our chapter Fellows and Life Fellows, share the great offerings and assets that ACHE has to offer, and make a call to action to Fellows to give back to the chapter as committee and board members, Regents, speakers and mentors to members, especially prospective Fellows," says Oyinkansola "Bukky" Ogunrinde, the chapter's 2022 president.

In addition, the chapter's 170 Fellows and Life Fellows were recognized along with a special acknowledgement of the 2022 Fellows on the chapter's LinkedIn page.

The inaugural Fellow event was held in 2021 virtually and featured keynote speaker Matthew A. Love, president/CEO of Nicklaus Children's Health System. In 2022, the first in-person event, which was sponsored by Memorial Healthcare System, was held and the chapter presented its inaugural Chapter Fellow Service Award.

David Smith, FACHE, executive vice president/CFO, Memorial Health System, has served on the chapter's finance committee during the past two years as a speaker and is a mentor to many ACHE members and Fellows. Given his service and commitment to the chapter, he became the first recipient of the prestigious 2022 Chapter Fellow Service award.

"I am humbled to receive the ACHE of South Florida chapter's first Chapter Fellow Service Award. As a CFO, I felt that becoming a Fellow was important to deepen my connection to our patients and our mission. ACHE offers so many opportunities to learn and grow and advance your career, and giving back through volunteering helps me keep that connection. Thank you, South Florida Chapter, for this great honor," said Smith.

"This event reflects the appreciation of ACHE of South Florida for its Fellows, who show the deepest commitment and dedication," says Jenna Merlucci, FACHE, who serves as the 2022 president-elect and oversaw the production of this successful event.

DEI Recognition in Michigan

At its annual meeting in November, the Great Lakes Chapter of the American College of Healthcare Executives honored one individual and two organizations who exemplify its values around diversity, equity, belonging and inclusion with its

DEBI Awards:

- Kimberly L. McVicar, DHA, an associate professor at Ferris State University, was selected for expanding her personal knowledge of these values, promoting them in her classroom, and for authoring chapters, books and published articles on DEI.
- MyMichigan Health was selected for its explicit focus on diversity and inclusion in its Vision 2025, DEI Advisory Committee, and a dedicated team within human resources to improve hiring and promotion from a DEI perspective.
- Sparrow Health System was selected for its ongoing commitment to DEI, including its adoption of eight key DEI principles for improvement, Women in Leadership program, DEI Leadership Development Program and development of implicit bias training.

The chapter congratulates them for their extraordinary accomplishments and inspiration.

May/June 2023 Issue Providing Award Winning Service

ACHE chapters focus on FACHE® advancement and DEI initiatives.

ACHE chapters are providing opportunities for members to prepare for the Board of Governors Examination in Healthcare Management. Learn about some of the efforts from the past year, along with news about diversity, equity and inclusion initiatives and results from the 2023 Chapter Management and Awards Program.

Exam Preparation in Missouri

Over 12 weeks last fall, the Missouri Chapter of the American College of Healthcare Executives launched its inaugural Board of Governors Exam Study Group. Hosted virtually, 11 weekly sessions covered each of the 10 knowledge areas, and one week was dedicated to Exam specifics and test-taking tips. Study materials and session recordings were provided to all registrants.

Volunteer Fellows from across the chapter led each session. There were 15 registrants with a dozen, on average, attending each session.

The chapter is thankful to the inaugural class of registrants for making the event successful, affording an opportunity to study and for early careerists to network, build a cohort, grow professionally and be introduced to ACHE Fellow leaders across the state.

Many attendees were scheduled to take the Board of Governors Exam during the months following the course's completion, and the event's coordinators have been optimistic that the chance to study together has been a positive layer in the Exam takers' preparation.

The chapter is especially thankful for the roster of chapter Fellows who did a phenomenal job hosting each of their sessions.

Exam Preparation in Maryland

Maryland Association of Health Care Executives, too, offered its members a Board of Governors Prep Course virtually, a series of 11 sessions to provide in-depth studies for the Exam. The chapter also promoted the program to ACHE's Asian Healthcare Leaders online community to expand the opportunity to advance to Fellow for Asian leaders. It also shared this event with other chapters that are currently not offering an Exam prep course. There were 43 participants, including residents and nonresidents of Maryland, many of whom passed the Exam.

The chapter's leadership also has been diligent with membership efforts led by its membership director. In November, it instituted a "reclaim your membership" drive to call members whose ACHE membership had lapsed and to encourage them to renew. The chapter is pleased to report that its membership has once again increased to more than 1,000 after a brief decline.

DEI Journey in North Texas

In 2022, ACHE of North Texas had a goal to become a strong, proactive chapter in the areas of diversity, equity and inclusion and its multiyear journey to create belonging.

The chapter's DEI journey started in 2016, and in 2022, it revamped the representation of its board leadership and appointed its first Black/Latina president. It also held a DEI-focused strategic planning retreat, integrated DEI goals in all committee work and assembled its first Asian Healthcare Leaders Community of North Texas event. Additionally, its Education Committee partnered with the DEI Committee on a case study focused on disparate impact and underserved communities, and the DEI Committee also started providing a social media posting recognizing heritage and special calendar recognitions.

This year, ACHE of North Texas created a DEI officer role. It also is working on initiatives to be more visible in underserved communities and is looking to expand board representation to include a disabled member.

Since 2017, the DEI Committee has grown 170%, to 27 members from 10 in 2022. Additionally, DEI education panel topics have increased 700%, to seven panels in 2022 from one panel in 2017.

Conversations among committee leadership help foster inclusion and success stories in committee work. Committee members are feeling more empowered to make sure their ideas and groups are represented. The chapter sees its DEI efforts as a model for members' own organizations to create a more diverse, equitable and inclusive environment, as well as to deliver more compassionate care to the diverse patient populations they serve.

Congratulations to Our Winning Chapters

At the 2023 Congress on Healthcare Leadership, 16 ACHE chapters received performance awards as part of the Chapter Management and Awards Program. The award-winning chapters were honored during the Malcolm T. MacEachern Memorial Lecture and Luncheon. To receive recognition, chapters must meet or exceed one or more of the four performance standards based on a tiered recognition system.

ACHE uses the information from reports submitted by chapters to calculate the performance standards that must be met for the year. These performance standards are set annually by taking a three-year average of performance at the 90th percentile level for each standard.

Five chapters won the Award of Chapter Distinction; 11 chapters won the Award of Chapter Merit; and five chapters won the Award for Sustained Performance. For a complete listing, visit ache.org/ChapterManagementAwards.
