My term as Regent officially began on Saturday, March 23rd during the ACHE Council of Regents Meeting. As your newly elected Regent, I look forward to helping connect you with all the resources available through the American College of Healthcare Executives nationally as well as locally within our own Nevada Chapter. Whether you are a new grad or early careerist looking for resources to further your career or a senior executive seeking new or innovative ways to approach healthcare leadership, ACHE is here to help you expand your skills and your network. I want to extend my

sincerest gratitude to our **outgoing Regent for Nevada, Vick Gill, MD, FACHE**. His service and dedication to ACHE and ACHE-Nevada Chapter has created a strong foundation for us to build upon.

For those who are new to ACHE or are unfamiliar with the ACHE governance structure, the Council of Regents is made up of leaders elected to represent their members and influence the greater good of the organization. With an understanding of ACHE's policies, programs, services, and the needs of its members, the Council harnesses its collective skill to advance ACHE's vision, mission, and values. As regent, it was my absolute pleasure to attend the ACHE Congress on Healthcare Leadership this year to represent Nevada and connect with ACHE-Nevada members, past and present. The opening session's keynote speaker **Daniel Pink** spoke about **regret – an emotion that is so often misunderstood – and the power of regret.** Regret is what makes us human and is the most common negative feeling that is shared by everyone. How often have we looked back on our lives and wished we had done something different? Many of you know that I tragically and unexpectedly lost an incredibly dear friend in late 2022 and in the aftermath, I found myself with not only a lot of grief but also a whole lot of regret. Regret that made me consciously start considering and reconsidering what mattered in my life and in my work. As healthcare leaders, we often bring our work home with us, whether we mean to or not. Our work becomes our life. We go about our days with our hospitals, clinics, staff, patients at the top of our minds. We eat, sleep, and drink our fields. We go on vacation (or, sometimes, we *don't* go on vacation) and we think about our work. We think about our doctors, nurses, techs, and aids. We hope. We worry. And sometimes something happens that changes our world view and then... we regret.

We believe that pang of regret indicates that something is wrong: that we said the wrong thing, did the wrong thing, made the wrong choice. Daniel Pink taught us that is not true. Regret, when we treat it right, can be useful. Regret clarifies what we value and can make us better. Looking at our lives and our careers through the photographic negative of regret can help us negotiate more effectively, solve problems faster and better, avoid cognitive biases, become better strategists, and deepen our sense of meaning.

I encourage you to reconsider your regrets: your foundational regrets, your boldness regrets, the moral ones, and the regrets about missed connections, and use them for good. Do the work. Reach out. Make the connection. Be bold. Take the risk. Make no small plans. And we here at ACHE will be here to help you.

highlighted in **"Building a United Workplace**" (2024), the correlation between DE&I and employee engagement is unmistakable. Leaders who grasp this connection foster higher engagement levels and enhanced team performance.

Our committee empowers every chapter member by promoting a deeper understanding of DE&I through tailored strategies and implements that resonate with each organization.

One of our flagship initiatives, Courageous Conversations (CC), is a virtual platform occurring bi-monthly at 6:00 p.m. PST. This forum fosters open dialogue and expands knowledge on DE&I topics, ensuring a space free from judgment where members and non-members can engage respectfully. We value your perspectives and experiences and believe your

participation will enrich our discussions. Our recent June session explored workplace identity and issues pertinent to the LGBTQ+ community. Central themes included the creation of safe spaces, respect for individual autonomy, and the recognition and mitigation of microaggressions. Emphasizing the importance of bias training emerged as a key recommendation to safeguard the identities and privacy of our staff members.

During our yearly Mentorship kick-off, our chairperson demonstrated the insidious nature of implicit bias through a training session with the mentorship committee. Many participants were surprised to realize how subtle biases—such as those triggered by a person's name or accent—can influence judgments and attitudes.

**The Nation of Patriots**, a nationally registered 501 C 3 organization was founded to help veterans wounded in service to our country. Each summer, the Nation of Patriots conducts **"The Patriot Tour".** A large American flag is escorted around the country by volunteers, making stops throughout the continental United States. In addition, and in conjunction with the Patriot Tour, volunteers conduct independent events to raise funds, specifically to help deserving veterans in their local communities. Absolutely one hundred percent of the money raised by the Nation of Patriots, as well as local chapters goes towards helping our veterans.

The criteria for veterans to be considered for financial assistance are two-fold. First, the veteran, injured in service to our country, second, the veteran must demonstrate financial need as determined by the Regional Commander.

Supporting these events over the years are the Metropolitan Police Department, the Las Vegas Mayor, the Las Vegas City Council, the Las Vegas Fire and Rescue, and the Nevada Healthcare Forum, whose four founding chapters are HFMA, ACHE, HLA NV, and HIMSS.

This year we had **92 golfers and 16 volunteers** who had an amazing day of golf, great weather, and incredible fellowship within our medical community.

Special thanks to our title Sponsor, **University Medical Center** (Mason VanHouweling and Tony Marinello) as well as our other sponsors who for years have made this an incredible event in support of our local veterans.

Over the last 9 years, Las Vegas has raised a substantial amount of funds to benefit our veterans receiving care at the Michael O'Callaghan Federal Hospital at Nellis AFB and the local VA. We have raised over \$362,000 in the last 9 years for our local service personnel. This year, we are proud to announce that we raised



over \$51,000 for our local veterans, making the total over the last 10 years over \$413,000.

The Southern Nevada medical community really steps up each year to support our veterans and the community. You should all be proud of the work you do to serve our patients and charities like the Nation of Patriots could not continue their great work without your support.

We look forward to next May to have even a bigger and better golf outing.






